AMBASSADOR EDWARD M. GABRIEL

has an extensive background in international affairs, having convened multilateral policy forums involving national security, environmental, and trade and energy issues. He has been involved in matters of Russian and European nuclear non-proliferation and safety, and he



has been active in advising the US Government on Mideast policy matters. From November, 1997-March 2001, he was the US Ambassador to the Kingdom of Morocco during which time a new US-Morocco strategic relationship was launched on political, military and economic levels.

Previously, Ambassador Gabriel was President and Owner of The Gabriel Group, Inc.; Senior Vice President in charge of corporate affairs for the CONCORD Corporation; and, President and CEO of the Madison Public Affairs Group, Inc. Ambassador Gabriel is currently President and CEO of The Gabriel Company, LLC which represents American corporations on investment strategies for international projects.

KIM KORTH is President and owner of IRN, Inc., a well-known consulting firm specializing in strategic advisory services to middle market manufacturing. She founded IRN in 1983 and has spearheaded its growth into a leading consulting firm for global automotive suppliers. Kim earned a B.A. from Western Michigan University in 1977 and an M.I.M. from the American



Graduate School of International Management (Thunderbird) in 1980. She also spent her junior year in college at the University of Wales in the United Kingdom in 1975-6. Her work has centered on helping suppliers understand the dynamics and structure of their industry, and how they should position

themselves to compete in an increasingly volatile worldwide market. Her primary role has been in management

consulting and planning, guiding companies to establish sustainable strategies for growth and improved financial performance.

Consistently ranked one of the top speakers in the industry, her views on middle market manufacturers are frequently quoted in major publications. She has traveled extensively in the past few years as a featured speaker at numerous domestic and international conferences, and has presented addresses for various financial institutions and trade associations including FIA.

TOM FARANDA was named one of the most exciting speakers in America by *Meetings & Conventions Magazine*. He is the former President of The Hospital Corporation of Chicago, the former National Accounts Sales Manager for The Masonite Corporation and a



former candidate for the United States Senate. His books include *The Global Sales Professional* and *Uncommon Sense Leadership*, and he has published over one hundred business articles. Faranda has earned a BS, an MBA in International Business and a Doctorate. He has been a guest lecturer for

universities in South Africa, the UK, Australia and was an adjunct faculty professor of business at the University of Minnesota.

His global experience is extensive with clients such as Siemen's Engineering Germany, IBM Europe, Siemens Medical South Africa, Thermo-King Japan, Ford Canada, GE, Prudential Singapore, Creative Communications India, St. Tom USVI, INTEL, Motorola, 3M, IBM, Honeywell and other corporations.

DR. KEN MAYLAND is President of ClearView Economics, LLC, a firm specializing in economic research and forecasting. His presentation at previous FIA Annual Meetings was so well received, he has been invited back. Ken was previously the Chief Economist of First Pennsylvania Bank and KeyCorp and has spent more than thirty years studying the business cycle and providing economic analyses to a variety of constituencies. Ken was named as *Business Week Magazine's* most accurate forecaster for 2006. Ken has also won several awards in recent years from the Federal Reserve Bank of

Chicago for "best forecasts." In 2004, *Bloomberg Magazine* identified Dr. Ken as "the nation's top forecaster." For the mid-2004 to mid-2005 forecast, *Bloomberg*



Magazine had Dr. Ken as the best forecaster (tied) of the unemployment rate and the fifth best forecaster of the inflation rate.

In 2007 Dr. Ken won the Lawrence R. Klein award for Blue Chip Economic Indicators forecast accuracy. This award is presented by Arizona State University for the person who best forecasted real GDP, CPI inflation, the unemployment rate, and the three-month Treasury bill rate over the four-year period 2003-2006.

ANDREW WINSTON is an Environmental Expert with a Masters of Environmental Management from Yale. He served as the Director of the Corporate Environmental Strategy Project at the University's renowned School of Forestry and Environmental Studies. He received his BA in Economics from Princeton and MBA from Columbia.



As a Corporate Advisor, Winston has significant corporate experience as a corporate strategy consultant and marketing executive. His clients include Bank of America, HP and IKEA. As author and commentator, he is the co-author

of *Green to Gold*, a best selling guide to what works, and what doesn't, when companies go green. He writes regularly for Harvard Business Review and Huffington Press and is widely quoted in many publications including *The Wall Street Journal*, *Time*, *Business Week Magazine* and *Forbes*.

and Indian Wells, the Park is home to more than 450 animals representing over 152 species including coyotes, big horn sheep, Oryx, giraffes, zebras, cheetahs, leopards and meerkats.

Additionally, there are lush botanical gardens representing 10 different desert ecosystems, showcasing more than 1,200 varieties of plants, all of which are native to desert environments. Specialized gardens include the Hummingbird Garden, the McDonald Butterfly & Wildflower Garden and the Marian Miner Cook Hummingbird & Butterfly Pavilion, which features over 30 species of butterflies and several types of hummingbirds. This private walking tour will include a *Behind the Scenes Tour* of the animal hospital, where injured, wild desert animals are nursed back to health.

The rotating cable cars are the most advanced in the world and guide passengers 2 1/2 miles up the mountainside to a height of 8,516 ft. 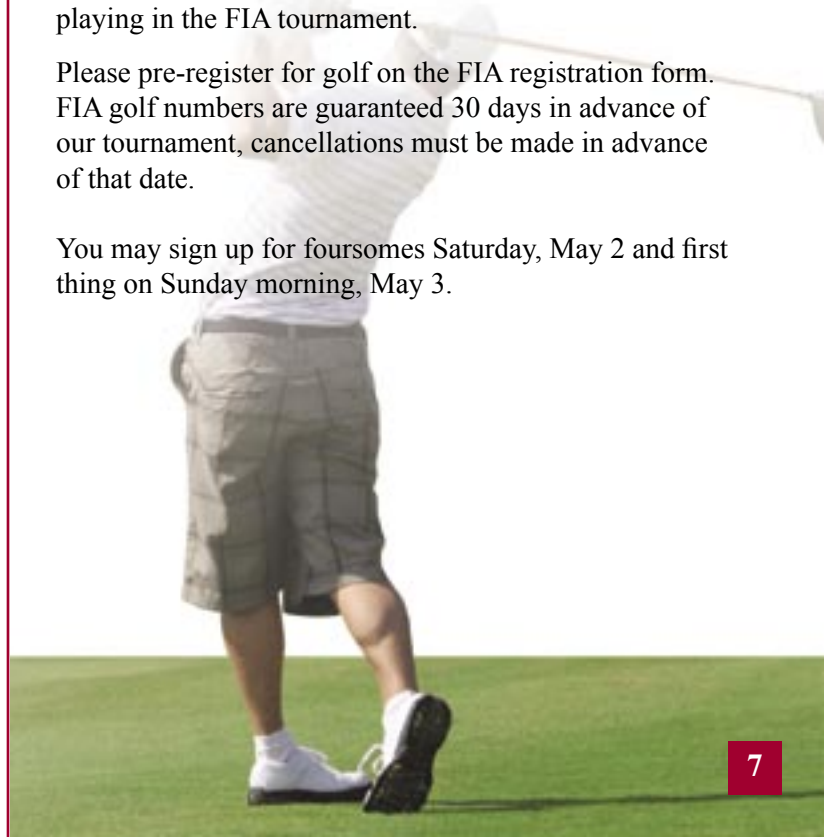

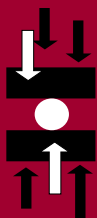
AIRPORT & TRANSFERS

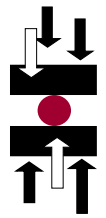

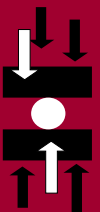
